The College Academic Dress

a) **Gown**: A University of Toronto BA style, black regent body; yoke outlined and sleeves looped up with blue cord; sleeves cut shorter: 22 ½ inches in front, and 35 inches at the back. Made of bengaline.

b) **Hood**:

Fellow: A University of Toronto doctoral shape; the cape is of royal blue bengaline lined in white taffeta with one 5 inch royal chevron. The cowl is bordered with 3 inches of white velvet on the outside, tapered toward the neck band and turned over ½ inch onto the lining. The loop is of black soutache. The keeper is of white braided soutache with two white buttons.

Associate: A University of Toronto doctoral shape, though smaller. The cape is of royal blue bengaline, lined with white. The cowl is bordered with 2 inches of white velvet inside and outside of the anterior edge only. The loop is of black soutache.

Colleague: As for associates, except for the border of the cowl, which is 1 inch of white taffeta. The loop is of black soutache.

Professional Diploma in Choral Conducting: The cape is of royal blue bengaline. The lining is of white taffeta with one 5" bright gold chevron. The border is 3" of white velvet on the outside anterior edge, tapering towards neckband and turned over 1/2" onto lining. The trim is a bright yellow cord on outside anterior edge where the white velvet meets the blue shell. The loop is of black soutache. The keeper is of white braided soutache with two white buttons.

Choir Director: As for the fellow or associate, as appropriate, with the addition of a bright yellow cord on the cowl, where the velvet meets the blue cape.

Note: Members who obtained their diplomas prior to the redesign of the academic dress in 1996 are still entitled to wear the robes authorised at the time.
