



Jeff McLeod is a Toronto-based Hammond organist and pianist. He holds Doctorate and Masters degrees from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester NY where he studied with noted jazz musicians and educators Harold Danko, Bill Dobbins and Dariusz Terefenko, and worked as a course instructor for four years. It was during his time at Eastman that Jeff began to seriously study the Hammond organ, establishing the presence of jazz organ at Eastman which remains to this day. The focus of his doctoral research was the life and music of noted jazz organist Don Patterson. This research culminated in a lecture recital presented in conjunction with Eastman's department of Organ, Sacred Music, and Historical Keyboards, with department chair David Higgs serving as advisor along with professors Danko and Dobbins from the Department of Jazz and Contemporary Music. Jeff also holds a Bachelor of Music Education from the University of Regina where he studied classical piano with William Moore.
